YARMOUTH.—The Herald of last week gives a full list of the shipping owned in that county. It is something of which they may well be proud. MARGAREE, C. B.—A correspondent writes: "This locality was visited on 4th Nov. last, with a very destructive flood. The freshet was caused we think by heavy snows on the Northern Mountains more than by the amount of rain. It rained only for about 5 or 7 hours. However the waters in the brooks and River, rose higher than ever was seen by the oldest inhabitant of the place except once nearly 50 years since. The freshet destroyed much valuable land, the river changing its course in several places, almost totally destroying such farms as it went through carrying bridges and fences in every direction.
