Public Notice is hereby given that under authority of Act 34 Vic. Chap 6 of the Dominion Parliament, Government Savings Bank Branches will be opened on the 1st July, 1872 at the undermentioned places in the Province of Nova Scotia, and in charge of the following Agent:

Deposits will be received in sums of one dollar and multiples of a dollar up to any amount, and repaid on demand, with interest at the rate of four per cent. per annum, from date of deposit to date of withdrawal.

Government has, however, recently established an issue of Dominion Stock, bearing 5 per cent interest, to which monies remaining on deposit in any Savings Bank for at least one month, may be transferred in sums of \$100, or on the whole not to exceed \$1000 for any one depositor.

The Stock is not transferable, but will be redeemed on three months' notice from depositor; otherwise the interest will be paid half yearly on the 31st April, and 31st October.

The Offices will, until further notice, be open daily from 10 a.m. to 3 o'clock, p.m. Further information may be obtained on application to the Agents.
