

With an instrument having this attachment, if a tune written in the key of G be found too high for the voices, the performer can at a single movement shift his key-board, and so lower the pitch a whole or halt-stop or tone; the singers really singing in the key of G flat or F, while the player still plays as if in G. The e who have had experience in accompanying vocal, and especially church music, know how often it is desirable to change the key and sing at a higher or lower pitch, and how difficult it is for the player to do this, and will appreciate the value of the invention.


