The supposition is that it was caused by the stove pipe igniting the wood work around it.

Mr. Spinney and his wife went to a neighbor's house and were from home from 6 to 9 o'clock. The children all slept in one room up stairs, in two beds, and Mr. Spinney's mother (who was old and insane) in a room below. When the fire was discovered it had made considerable headway. Mr. Spinney was the first that arrived, the house being then all ablaze. He carried a at the upper window broke that in and made several attempts to enter the room and rescue the children, but in vain, for the smoke was so stifling and the flames so fierce that he failed to effect an entrance. Thus, in one hour, were those poor people deprived of all that they held dear-habitation, provisions, clothes, household effects, and last, but not least, their five poor children, so suddenly destroyed in such a fearful manner.

The names and ages of the children were as follows :- Herman E., aged 10 years and 5 months; Rebecca L., 9 years; Ella J., 7 years and 4 months; Delphenia B., ageu 4 years; Eudora E., 1 year and 6 months.

This sad event has cast deep gloom over the locality where it occurred, and the people evince a profound sympathy for Mr. and Mrs. Spinney in their sweeping and distressing bereavement.




