RULES FOR THE CARE OF SHEEP.

We copy the following suggestions about sheep from a circular issued by E. C. D. McKay, the General Agent of the American Emigrant Company.

- 1. Keep sheep dry under foot with litter. This is even more necessary than roofing them. Never let them stand or lie in mud or snow.

Cow STABLES.—I will give your readers my experience in making stable floors for milch cows. In stabling milch cows in winter, their bags are often badly besmeared, and consequently it is a dirty job to milk.

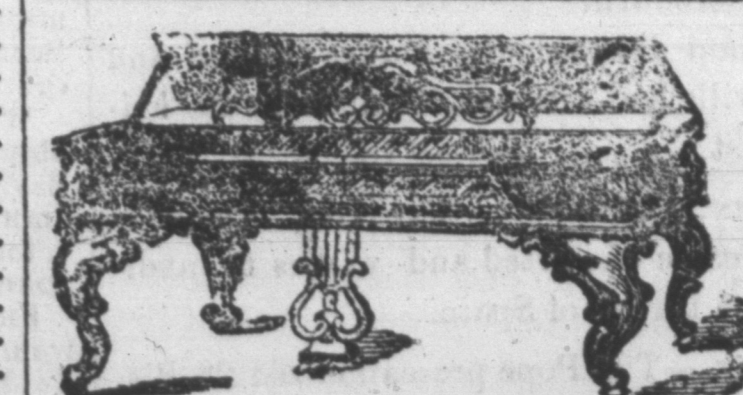
