

The following Extract. in proof of the Authenticity of the above Portrait, is translated from the Latin contemporary Historians of the period.

" News to the Senate of Rome concerning JESUS CARIST in the days of Tiberius Cæsar the Emperor, as the govenors of sundry provinces under the Senate and people of Rome used to advertise the Senate of such news as chanced in diverse countries.

" Publius Lentulus, being at that time president in Judea, wrote an epistle to the Senate and people of Rome, the words whereof were
