Re-bonding and Re-warehousing of Tea and Coffee.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that all the Custom duties whether specific or ad valorem now payable on Tea or Coffee imported into Canada shall be repaid upon, from and after the 1st of July. AND NOTICE is further given that TEA and COFFEE in the Original Packages on which such duties have been paid may be re-bonded and re-warehoused at any time before the TWENTY-NINTH day of JUNE, in the present year, and that on their being so re-bonded and re-warehoused the amount of the specific duties paid on such Tea and Coffee, shall be repaid to the owner thereof and a drawback by the Collector of Customs at the Port where they are so re-bonded and re-warehoused, or by the Receiver General.
