MAIL SERVICE FROM GASPE BASIN to the North Shore of the Gulf of

St. Lawrence.

The Mail paket Orion (a fast sailing schooner) will leave Gaspe Basin with the Mails, twice a month, 1st and 15th; as soon as practible after the arrival of the Mail Steamers from Quebec. and from Nova Scotia New Brunswick, and Bay des Chaleurs, and will call and exchange Mails both going and returning at the following places on the North Shore:-Sheldrake, Magpie, Mingan and Fsquimaux Point.

Once a month, that is on the second trip of each month, the packet will proceed from Esquimaux Point and call at Natashquan during every month of the season of Navigation. except November; and from Natasi quan will call at Bell or Fox Bay, on the North-east coast of the Island of Anticosti in every month ex cept May October and November.

Thus, Mails will be exchanged twice a month during the season of Navigation with Sheld-rake, Magpie, Mingan and Esquimaux Point and once a month in the months specified, with Natashquan and Belle Bay Anticesti. A. CAMPBELL,
