

husband's administration under Mary's protection.

GERMANY.—Berlin, July 2.—The Emperor William departs for Inns tomorrow, thence to Gastein. It is expected he will visit Vienna at the end of August.

Bismarck leaves soon for his estates at Varzin, where he intends to remain until late in the autumn.

ITALY.—London, July 3.—A despatch from Bellona, 50 miles north of Venice, says shocks of earthquake were felt in that city and adjacent country this morning.

The violence of the earthquake was in the country North of Venice, where its effects were terrible, both in loss of life and ruin of property.

At Bellona four persons were killed and several injured; at Corres two were killed; at Carago four; at Parus eleven; Veroneta; and at Cavessago one. More earthquakes occurred on Saturday, but no damage is reported.

Several churches are in ruins, many badly shattered, and hundreds of houses levelled to the ground. The inhabitants have not yet recovered from the terror; thousands are encamped in the fields, but there has been no recurrence of the shock.

SPAIN.—A despatch to the Times from Madrid on Thursday says there is a great alarm in that city in consequence of menacing attitude of "Irreconcilables," who are known to be intriguing for overthrow of the present Government.

Troops are concentrated at strategic points, and every precaution taken to promptly suppress any outbreak.

The draft of the new Constitution was submitted to the Cortes today. It provides that the President of the Republic must have been born in Spanish territory, and be at least 25 years of age.

The country is divided into Cantons, like the Swiss Republic. The Assembly of each Canton is to elect four Senators, and Deputies are to be chosen by universal suffrage. Cuba and Porto Rico are to be assimilated with the Cantons of Spain.

The Central Power is authorized to suspend constitutional guarantees, and order levies for troops without first consulting the authorities of the Cantons.

The present Spanish Ministry is regarded as satisfactory to all parties.

The Government has decided to discharge the soldiers whose terms have expired, but to offer them two reus per diem to re-enlist. If the result is unsatisfactory it will appeal to the patriotism of the country to supply combatants against the Carlist, stating frankly the situation and the state of Spain.

General Carbinok announces that he has defeated the Carlists under Caballo.

The Progressiva Club has discontinued its sittings because of the suspension of constitutional guarantees.

BURMA.—The Chinese have captured Moumet, a capital town of Burma, by assault, and there was a great slaughter of its defenders and inhabitants.

INDIA.—A despatch from Bombay announces a rising among the Hindoo peasants in the district of Poonah. They have refused to pay rents and have plundered and burned several houses. Two bands have been dispersed by the police.
