Some varieties, generally the best, are faced in order to exhibit the fineness of their texture. After being forwarded to the warehouse, the largest slabs are cut into pieces of about three and a half feet in length, eighteen inches in width and ranging from one half inch to three inches in thickness. From five to twenty-five cents per pound is the usual price paid by the cork cutter in this country for the rough material as it arrives in the bale. Every portion of the material is utilized, either as stuffing for cushions or life preservers, ornas a non-conducting substance for placing between walls or floors of buildings to deaden sound. It has been estimated that it would require 4,000 men to be continually at work to supply New York alone with corks, if all had to be made by hand. There are at present 60 manufactories in the United States, cutting and supplying corks to the value of \$250,000 per year.-Scientific American.


