**SURGICAL OPERATION.**—On Friday last, Mr. Michael Hinds, Senr., had his thigh amputated by Dr. Dennison of Bridgetown, and Dr. Morse of Lawrenceville, an operation which bids fair to be successful.

On Sabbath last, we hear, Rev. J. B. McDonald, M. D., Baptist Minister, preached his farewell sermon at Bedouque, where he has labored in his Master's service for nearly four years. He has accepted a call to North Sydney, Cape Breton, and on the eve of his departure for his new field of gospel work, he was presented by his Bedouque brethren with a flattering Address, to which he made a suitable reply. The church was crowded to overflowing on the occasion, and a general regret was felt at the prospect of separation. He leaves the Island with the best wishes and prayers, not only of his brethren in that settlement, but of his numerous friends throughout the Colony. #### MISCELLANEOUS.

**AN ALLEGORY.**—"Patience! until I become a butterfly, and then I shall laugh at all my enemies." This was a common saying with a caterpillar, while it was yet a caterpillar. At last the moment of its transformation came. On a beautiful summer's morning it arose out of its dark sepulchre, dressed in a rich golden attire, and strong in the strength of a new life. "Yes," said she, as she looked upon herself, "now that I am satisfied with nature; now I am safe! But alas! she cried. A single leaf could screen the dark-hued caterpillar from many enemies, even from the sharp-sighted hunter of insects. Now, as a many-colored butterfly she shone in radiant beauty, drew on her the eyes of a hundred pursuers, and saw only too soon the impossibility of eluding them all. In vain she plied her new-born wings with diligence, in vain she flew hurriedly from bough to bough, flower to flower. The craft of her enemies surprised her after all, and on the third day she was impaled upon the murderous needle of an entomologist. A dazzling glory is often the forerunner of destruction.

**ARTIFICIAL COAL.**—There is an artificial coal establishment in France which produces the large amount of 100,000 tons annually. The machine used for this purpose is said to be capable of producing ten tons of the fuel per hour, with the motive power of eighty horses, the whole machine weighing about sixty-five tons, with all its accessories and gear, including the steam engine. The coal bricks are slightly heavier than natural coal, and their elastic effort is found fully equal, and, in some cases, even superior to the latter. The process of washing removes about five per cent. of the weight of the coal dust, representing incombustible impurities, and the compressed fuel leaves only six to seven per cent. of ashes. The fuel thus produced from mere coal dust is sold to the different railway companies and the navy, besides a great quantity for household use, for which purpose it is admirably adapted on account of its regularity of form, great cohesion, entire cleanliness, and high heating effect.

#### Provincial Medical Board.

THE following resolutions were passed at the recent meeting of the PROVINCIAL MEDICAL BOARD, and ordered to be published for the information of the profession:—

**Whereas**, The Medical Act of Nova Scotia requires a full and complete list of the regularly qualified Medical Practitioners in Nova Scotia to be made and published annually.

**And Whereas**, A number of the medical men in the Province have failed to make a return to the Registrar of their names, qualifications, &c., &c., as required by a recent order of this Board, thereby delaying the publication of the Medical Register as by law required.

**Therefore Resolved**, That all medical practitioners who have not complied with the order of this Board be requested to do so immediately, as the Registrar will be closed for this year on the first day of July, and immediately afterwards published.

**Resolved**, That the following epitome of the Act of the Act from 22 to 23 be published for the information of the profession and the public:—

"On and after the first day of May, 1873, every Medical practitioner whose name appears on the Medical Register of the Province, is duly qualified and licensed to practice Medicine, Surgery, and Midwifery in the Province of Nova Scotia, and none but legally qualified practitioners can hold public offices, sign certificates or collect fees in a Court of Law.
