The tribunal at Santiago de Cuba before which the prisoners captu on the "Virginia" were brought, condemned Terrale Verond Pedro Cesepes, Jesus Del Sol, and General Ryan to death.

A despatch from Madrid states that President Castelar, and General Sienes, U. S. Minister to Spain, had a long conference on Friday last, it is supposed about the steamer "Virginia."

Great victory of Carlists over government troops is announced, after a desperate fight in the Province of Navarre. Loss of Republicans very great, including among the killed Lieutenant-General Primo de Rivera, General Morbao was wounded and taken prisoner by the Royalists, with forty-one other officers. The Carlists also lost heavily. Among the wounded on their side was General Otto and other chiefs.

GERMANY.—The Reichrath was opened on the 5th inst., by the Emperor in person. The Emperor's speech was pacific with reference to foreign powers. It contains no other matter of interest.

The prevailing feeling in Berlin is one of satisfaction at the collapse of Comte de Chambord.

AUSTRIA.—The total admission to the Vienna Exhibition was 7,250,000.

INDIA.—Latest advices from India are a little more encouraging. The crops in some districts of Bengal are improving, and with continuance of favorable weather there are hopes that the famine may be avoided or greatly mitigated.

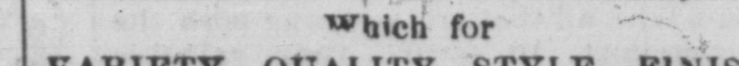
