The Annapolis " Farmer " reports that Mr. Alfred Munroe, while working in the saw mill of Mesers. Walsh & Co. at Bear River, fell dead instantaneously. A postmortem examination was held, but no satisfactory reason could be assigned for his death. The jury returned a verdict that the deceased came to his death by the visitation of God.

At the Supreme Court at Annapolis, last week, the Grand Jury, Magistrates, and Bar presented Judge McCully with a highly complimentary address. The learned Judge made an appropriate reply.

DIGBY is to have a new hotel built on the Wade property, quite near the landing. The hotel will be of capacity sufficient to accommodate about 200 persons comforta-bly, but room could be made for 250 if necessary. The estimated cost of the building is \$16,000. It is expected that the building will be completed and ready to enter by the 1st of July.

TEMPERANCE.—The Grand Division of Nova Scotia will meet in Annual Session in this City on 28th inst. The Grand Division of P. E. Island will meet in the previous

Delegations from the Grand Divisions of Quebec and P. E. Island are likely to be present at the annual meeting of the Grand Division of Nova Scotia.

One of our earnest temperance workers in Cape Breton, has placed in the hands of the Grand Worthy Patriarch the following suggestions for amendments to our present License Law:

1. Section 30 Chapter 19, Revise 1 Statutes to be amended as tollows: "Any person who shall sell or deliver to a minor or Indian, Intoxicating Liquor, &c."

2. The Right of appeal to be allowed the Clerk of License.

3. The Destruction of Liquors where kept for illicit sale; and no liceenses to be granted in Coal mining districts.

4. A Liquor agent to be appointed in each electoral districts.

5. Liquor agent to draw on the county Treasury for funds to purchase as tock of liquors suitable to the requirements of the District in which he is appointed.

6. Accommodation for Travellers, Horses; number of persons in family, including servants, to be stated in application for License by each applicant.

7. The name of not more than one applicant to be embodied in any one petition. 8. No groceries. Provisions or Dry Goods to be sold in any Licensed tavern or Liquor

These suggestions are really valuable. the result of years of experience; and while it may not be possible to secure all these amendments; and while amendments proposed by other brethren may be deemed more important than some of these, we vet are certain that some parts of the Country, especially where Licenses are still granted, would hail all these changes as harbingers of great progress in the Temperance reform.
