Whereas, The Medical Act of Nova Scotia requires a 'ull and complete list of the regular. ly qualified Medical Practitioners in Nova Scoti to be made and published annually

And Whereas, A number of the medical men in the Province have failed to make a return to the Registrar of their names, qualifications. &c., &c., as required by a recent order of this Board, thereby de'aying the pub ication of the Medical Register as by law

Therefore Resolved, That all medical practitioners who have not complied with the order of this Board be requested to do so immediately, as the Register will be closed for this year on the first day of July, and immediately afterwards published.

Resolved, that the following epitome of sections of the Act from 22 to 23 he published for the information of the profession and the public:-

"On and after the first day of May, 1873, every Medical practitioner whose name appears on the Medical Register of the Province, is duly qualified and licensed to practice Medici e, Surgery, and Midwifery in the Provi ce of Nova Scotia, and none but legally qualified practitioners can hold public offices, sign certificates or collect fees in a Court of
