Provincial Medical Board.

THE following resolutions were passed at the recent meeting of the PROVINCIAL MEDICAL BOARD, and ordered to be published for the information of the profession:—

Whereas, The Medical Act of Nova Scotia requires a full and complete list of the regularly qualified Medical Practitioners in Nova Scotia to be made and published annually...

Resolved, That the following epitome of section 4 of the Act from 22 to 29 be published for the information of the profession and the public:—

On and after the first day of May, 1873, every Medical practitioner whose name appears on the Medical Register of the Province, is duly qualified and licensed to practice Medical Surgery, and Midwifery in the Province of Nova Scotia, and none but legally qualified practitioners can hold public offices, sign certificates or collect fees in a Court of Law.
