A. Emmanuel & Co., of Montreal, the largest importers of cigars in the Dominion, have suspended, with liabilities of four hundred thousand dollars.

The work on the Victoria Railway has begun in good earnest.

The Court of Queen's Bench, at Fort Garry, Manitoba, has passed sentence of outlawry against Louis Riel.

The trial of Lepine, being accessory to the murder of Thomas Scott during the insurrection in the North West, has commenced at Fort Garry, Manitoba.

The Quebec Board of Trade has adopted a resolution declaring the proposed Reciprocity Treaty unfavorable to Canada.

A diabolical attempt was made to fire the Government Emigrant Shed at Quebec.

Owing to the action of Local Government the Dominion has been unable to obtain possession of the P. E. Island Railway.

A fire at Montreal on Monday damaged the stores of McArthur & Sons W. McGill to the amount of \$200,000.

The Governor-General will remain two weeks in the States before returning to Ottawa.
