Steam Communication Between CANADA AND THE West Indies.

To and from St. Thomas, Barbadoes, and Demerara.

TENDERS addressed to the Postmaster General of Canada, will be received at Ottawa, until SATURDAY, the 2nd January next, at noon, for the conveyance of her Majesty's Mail, either by monthly or fortnightly voyages, as persons tendering may propose, by first class steamships of not less than 1,200 tons gross measurement, and possessed of a speed of not less than nine knots per hour.

Such voyages to be performed in summer (while the navigation of the St. Lawrence is open), between Montreal and Georgetown, Demerara, calling at Quebec, Halifax, Bermuda, St. Thomas and Barbadoes, both ways; and during the remainder of the year between Halifax and Demerara, calling at Portland (Maine), Bermuda, St. Thomas and Barbadoes, but at no other port or ports without special consent and approval in writing, of the Postmaster General.

The service to commence 1st of June, 1875.

TO AND FROM CUBA.

Tenders addressed as above will also be received at the same time for a service of a similar character and frequency by steamships of same class, tonnage and speed as follows: in summer between Montreal and Havana (Cuba), calling at Quebec, Halifax, and Nassau (Bahamas) both ways; and in winter between Halifax and Havana, calling at Portland (Maine) and Nassau (Bahamas), both ways; but at no other port or ports, without the special consent and approbation in writing, of the Postmaster General.

This service to commence 1st of June, 1875. The further conditions in respect to both these services may be obtained on application at the Post Offices of Halifax, St. John, N. B., Quebec, Montreal, Kingston, Toronto and Hamilton, and at this Department.

Tenders will also be required to state in each case the difference if any of the steamers call at St. John, New Brunswick.
