Gen. Lomass is preparing a proclamation summoning the Carlist insurgents to surrender within eight days; and threatening to devastate the country occupied by them in case of further resistance

The German gunboats Nautilus and Albatross are withdrawn from Spanish To and from St. Thomas, Bar-

ITALY .- An anonymous letter, understood to emanate from the Premier of Italy, relating charges against the Italian Gov ernment, is published in Paris and Florence. It denies that the Pope is a prisoner, and declares that the Government of Victor Emmanuel will faithfully maintain Papal guarantees.

Turkey -- Sultan has given \$100,000 for the relief of the famine-stricken inhabitants in Angora. Their prospects are improving.

Russia .- News has reached St. Petersburg of the safe arrival in Kharastan, of the first Russian trading caravan which ever penetrated that country british agents are accused of creating dissensions among the native tribes.

A violent storm at St. Petersburg on Monday night caused an inundation of the lower part of the city, driving out of their houses many poor people, who are being fed in public kitchens.

Several of the Great Powers, including france, have given favorable answers to Russia's invitation to attend the St. Petersburg Conference.

A despatch from St. Petersburg says one column of the Russian troops has already crossed the Khivan frontier, and another is rapidly following.

China - A despatch from Hong King states that the steamship " Mongol " from Shanghae for New York was wrecked and sixteen persons perished.




