

If well dried, four pounds will contain one pound of gluten—an in- gredient which gives flour all its value,	CURING SKINS WITHOUT REMOVING THE HAIR.—A correspondent sends the following recipe for curing skins without semoving the hair. Take of soft water, ten gallons, wheat bran, one half bushel; salt, seven pounds sulphuric acid, two and a half pounds. Dissolve all together and place the skins in the solution, and allow them to remain twelve hours; then remove and clean them well, and again immerse twelve hours, or longer if necessary.
