## PUBLIC NOTICE.

THE ACT passed in the last Session of Parliament to amend and consolidate the Statute Law for the regulation of the Postal Service of the Domition, comes into operation on the 1st of October, 1875.

On and after that date the Rates of Postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by Mail to any place in Canada, will continue to be 3 cents per half-ounce weight, but the rate MUST BE PREPAID BY POSTAGE STAMP at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly UNPAID cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

Letters as aforesaid posted in Canada, and addressed to places in Canada, when weighing more than half an ounce, and liable therefore to two or more rates of postage, will be trans. mitted by mail to destination, though not fully prepaid, if as much as one full rate of Three Cents has been prepaid thereon by Pestage Stamp, but they will be forwarded charged with DOUBLE the amount of deficient postage. Thus, if such a letter, weighing more than a dos, and not expeeding 1 oz in weight be posted, prepaid 3 cents only, it will be rated 6 cents unpaid-" more to pay," and forwarded to its ad-

On letters posted at this office to be delivered in the city commonly known as "Drop Letters," the rate will be One Cent per half ounce, to be in all cases prepaid by Postage Stamp.

**NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.** Newspapers and Periodicals, printed and pub lished in Canada, and issued not less frequently than once amonth from a known office of Publication or News Agency, and addressed and posted by and from the same for transmission by mail to regular subscribers or News Agents in Canada, may be posted by the same on prepayment of a rate of One Cent for each pound | tage to inspect our stock before buying elseweight in bulk or fraction of a pound; and such | where. Newspapers and Periodicals are to be put up into packages and delivered into the Post Office and the postage rate thereon prepaid by the Publisher or News Agent, being the sender thereof, under such regulations as the Postmaster General may from time to time make. under the provisions of the Statute, is particularly directed to this clause, as their publications cannot legally be forwarded to subscribers or others by Mail after the 1st October, unless by Express, posted prepaid. On all Newspapers and Periodicals posted in Canada, other than those addressed to regular

the permission to post their publications prepaid

subscribers or News Agents, from the office of publication or News Agency, under the foregoing section, and including all Newspapers and Periodicals published less frequent y than once a month, the rate will be " one cent per four eunces," to be invariably prepaid by postage stamps. Nevertheless Newspapers and Periedicals weigning less than one o mee each may be posted singly, it prepaid by pestage stamp, one

Newspapers or Periodicals passing by mail between Canada and the United Kingdom, the United States, Newtoundland and places beyond sea, will cominue to be subject to the special regulations in respect of postage charges now or troin time to time hereafter in force, with regard to such transmissions. Such as may be posted in Canada for the United States or Newfoundland are to be prepaid the same rates as if addressed to places within the Dominioa.

On Miscell meous mail matter, such as books, pamphlets, occasional publications, printed circulars, &c, when posted in Canada for any place in Canada the rate of postage will be one cent per four ounces in weight, to be prepaid by any article of miscellaneous mail matter; and all transmissions authorised by this regulation must pe put up in covers, open at the ends or sides, or in such manner as to admit of inspect on to ensure compliance with this condition. Miscellaneous mail matter, when addressed to the United States or to Newfoundland may be forwarded when prepaid the one cent per 4 oz. rate, as if addressed to a place in Canada, with the exception of packets of samples and patterns of merchandise addressed to the United States, on which the special rate of ten cents

per 8 oz. must be prepaid as at present. Post Bands bearing a one cent impressed postage stamp have been prepared for the convenience of persons desiring to use them in transmitting newspapers or other mail matter passing at the one centrate and will be sold at the rate of four for 5 cents.

Postage Rate on Correspondence with the United Kingdom.

The postage rate on letters passing between Canada and the United Kingdom shall from and after the 1st October, 1875, be a uniform rate of two pence half-penny sterling, equal to five cents Canada currency, per half ounce, by whatever route sent or received, whether by Canada Packet direct, or by the closed mails via the United States.

A five cent postage stamp for the convenience of the public in prepaying the five cent rate on letters addressed to the United Kingdom after the 1st October, is being prepared and will be issued as soon as ready.

This reduction will not for the present affect t he charges on letters sent or received by way of England to or from foreign countries or places beyond sea.


