

BAPTISM in A TENT .- Mr. Ned Wright, who is working energetically amongst the lowest classes of South London, has just introduced to his mission a novelty in the shape of a movable baptistery to accompany his tent. It seems that a number of the converts attending his evangelistic services had expressed their desire to make public profession of their faith in Jesus by baptism, and accordingly arrangements were made to enable them to do so. The baptistery, constructed by Wright and assistants, is of considerable proportions, and composed of five separate pieces, which can be easily taken down and removed with the tent. It seemed to be admirably adapted for its purpose when it was used on the 1st instant, on which occasion forty men and youths were baptized. It was proposed to baptize the female portion of the converts on Wednesday last, but the hour at which we go to press prevents our giving details in this number. On the tormer occasion tickets of admission were issued for 1800, and the number using them was composed of all classes, some coming simply, no doubt, to see a baptizing in a tent. The opportunity was made available for the preaching of the Gospel, not without results, for at the atter-meeting some professed to have been saved. The address to the candidates was given by M. Hudder.




