

Postage Rate on Correspondence with the United Kingdom.

The postage rate on letters passing between Canada and the United Kingdom shall from and after the 1st October, 1875, be a uniform rate of two pence half-penny sterling, equal to five cents Canada currency, per half ounce, by whatever route sent or received, whether by Canada Packet direct, or by the closed mails via the United States.

A five cent postage stamp for the convenience of the public in prepaying the five cent sister, and the central one is the eldest rate on letters addressed to the United Kingdom after the 1st October, is being prepared
