New Moon, July 3rd, 1h. 10m. morning. First Quarter, " 10th, 6h. 26m. morning. Full Moon, " 18th, 9h. 12m. morning. Last Quarter, " 25th, 4h. 25m. afternoon.

Table with columns for Day, SUN. (Rise, Sets, South), MOON. (Rise, Sets, High Tides), and High Tides (at Halifax).

THE TIDES.—The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at PARSBORO, CORNWALLIS, HORTON, HANTSPOET, WINDSOR, NEWPORT, and TRURO.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of the sun's setting from 24 hours, and to the remainder add the time of rising.
