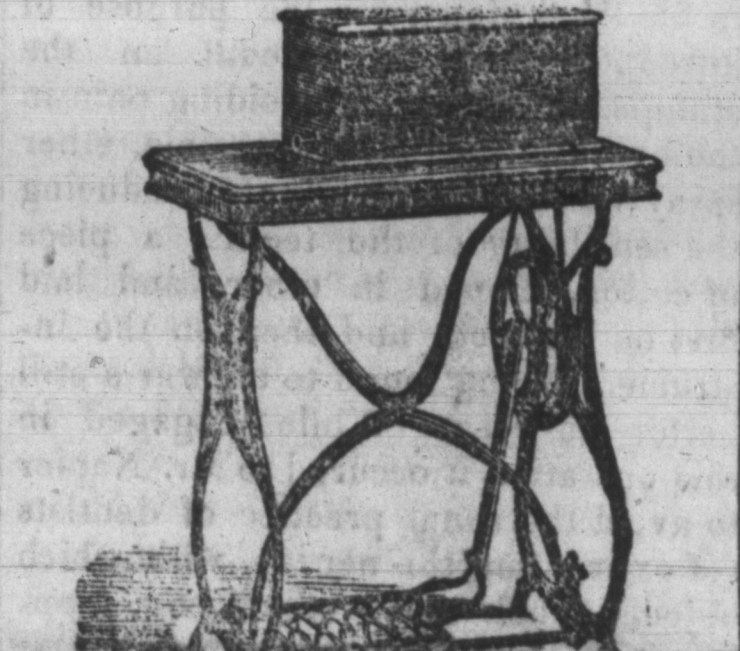

INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY.

THE GAUGE OF THIS RAILWAY will be changed to the NARROW GAUGE in the 18th and 19th of JUNE, 1875...

The Day Trains will run as usual on Thursday the 17th June, and be resumed again as per new time-table, on MONDAY, the 21st JUNE.

The Night Express between Halifax and St. John will be run on and after Monday, 28th June, 1875.

No Freight will be shipped after mid-day on Wednesday, 16th June, until Monday, the 21st June.

The Last Broad Gauge Train from Pictou will be that leaving the Landing at 6.45 a. m. on Thursday, the 17th June, and the last train from Truro will be the one leaving for Pictou at 11.05 a. m. on that day.

The Pictou Branch will be closed from Thursday afternoon, 17th June, until Tuesday the 22nd June, on which day the running of all trains will be resumed.

Passenger Traffic between St. John and Halifax will be entirely suspended on Friday and Saturday, the 18th and 19th June, and on the Pictou Branch on those days and also on Monday, the 21st June.

Freight Traffic will be entirely suspended from WEDNESDAY MORNING, the 16th JUNE to the end of the week, but will be fully resumed on MONDAY the 21st JUNE.

The public are respectfully requested to note these arrangements and to make their shipments as light as possible in the early part of the week ending 19th June.
