How TO EXTRACT PERFUME FROM FLOWERS.—Why do we waste the delicious odor of our flowers? No doubt it is simply through our ignorance.

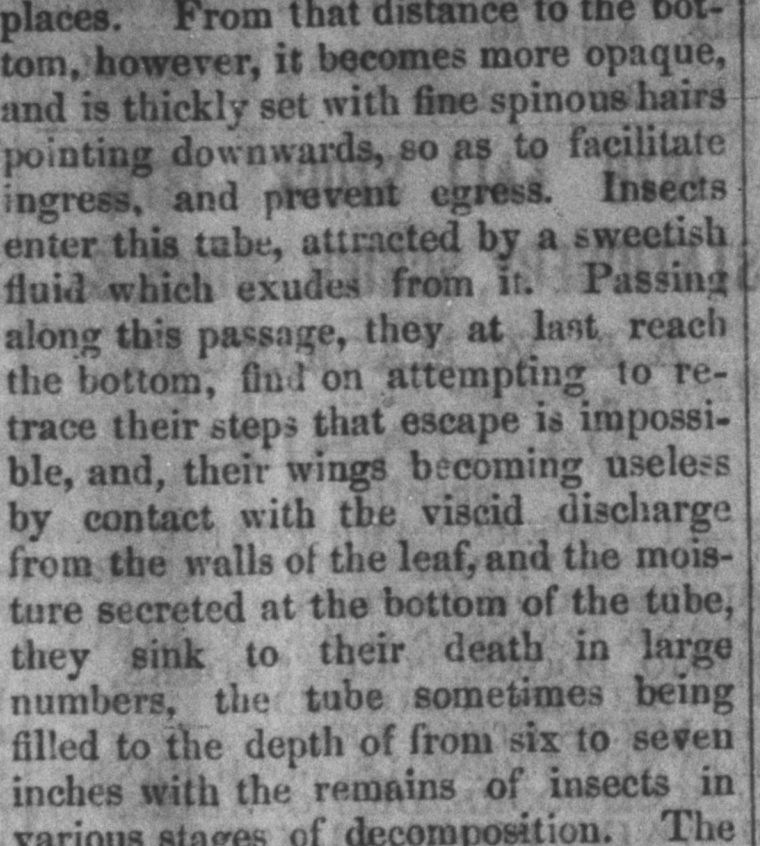
