THE TIDES.—The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at Parrsboro, Cornwallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, and Truro.

High water at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 2 hours and 11 minutes LATER than at Halifax. At Annapolis, St. John, N.B., and Portland Maine, 3 hours and 25 minutes LATER, and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 20 minutes EARLIER, than at Halifax.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of the sun's setting, from 12 hours and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.

THE CENTENNIAL.—The Great Corliss Steam Engine is one of the most marvellous things of the Exhibition.

"The cylinders are 40 inches in diameter, 10 feet stroke, and are rated at 1,400 horse power. The single shaft to which they are connected carries a magnificent gear wheel of 30 feet in diameter, 24 inches face, and having 216 teeth cut with a pitch of 5.183 inches.

The finest part of the whole machine is unfortunately out of sight, since it lies in covered ways under the floor. We allude to the gearing by which motion is imparted to the shaft.
