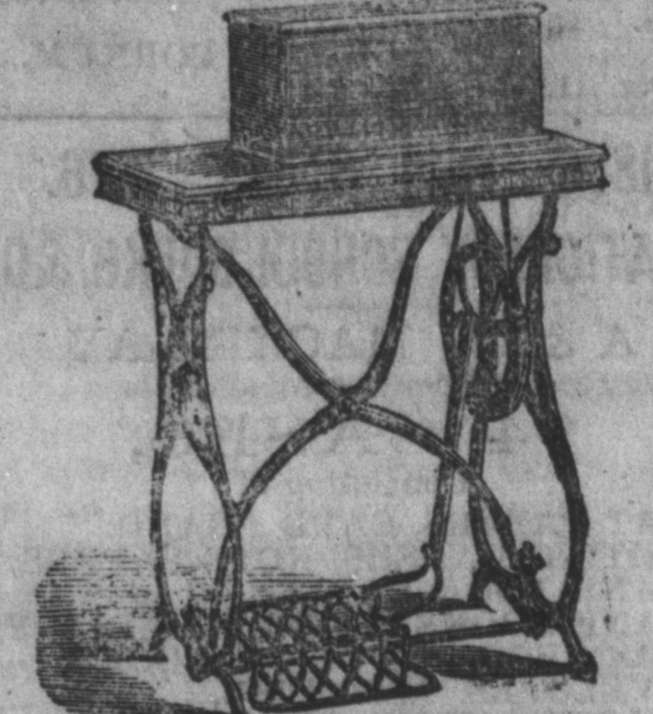
Last year a dolichocephalous skull was found near the same spot, which Dr. Broca, declared to belong to the age of stone.
