



YARMOUTH INSURANCE COMPANIES. -On Tuesday last the Commercial Insurance Company brought down a balance to the credit of the Company of \$38,000, and declared a dividend of two hundred and fifty dollars per share, payable July first. The gross premiums for the expired year being one hundred thousand dollars.

On Friday last thirty-two thousand dollars was the balance yesterday submitted by the Old Marine Insurance. Company and declared payable, one hundred and sixty dollars to the share, on July 15th.

The six companies together, for the year, issued two thousand three hundred and fifty policies. They insured property to the value of six millions five hundred and eighty three thousand dollars. The premiums amounted to four hundred and thirty-one thousand dollars. They have declared to the shareholders the balance of profits from the previous year's work, amounting to one hundred and eighty-nine thousand dollars. Taking it altogether there is no place in the world where insurance s effected as cheaply as in Yarmouth.
