THE HOUSEHOLD.

POPULAR GROVE FARM, UPPER MUSQUODOBOIT, July 20th 1877.—Dear Editor.—The following is a very good recipe for making yeast without hops,

Rhubarb Yeast.—Take half a dozen stocks of Rhubarb, cut and boil with very little water. When done, strain while hot, into a basin with two table spoonfuls of flour, one of sugar, also a pinch of salt.

GAPES.—We have learned to jest at gapes by making free use of camphor. We give to a chicken in a very bad case a pill the size of a small garden pea.

COFFEE FOR TIRED HORSES.—A veterinary surgeon of Prague is said to have discovered that strong coffee has a wonderfully reviving effect upon decrepit and overworked horses.

HOW TO MAKE COFFEE.—The Mocha and Java are considered best; yet I think that good coffee may be made from cheaper kinds.

SUNFLOWERS.—They are rich in honey, and are consequently good neighbors for bees. Oil, hardly to be distinguished from olive by any one but an expert may be extracted from the seeds in the proportion of one gallon to one bushel.

BEEF TEA MADE WITH ICE.—Beef tea can be made without using any heat whatever, except that generated by the thawing of ice—the change of water from a solid to a liquid form—by filling a deep dish with the dice-like pieces of beef, and then piling cracked ice on top.

To PREVENT GREY OR BUFF LINENS FROM SPOTTING.—Stir into the first water in which they are washed some black pepper. It will also prevent the colors running, when washing black or colored cambrics, or muslins; and the water is not injured by it, but just as soft as before the pepper was put in.

AGRICULTURE.

IMPROVING SEED BY SELECTION.—Mr. Hallett an English farmer writes:

Very close observation during many years has led me to the discovery that the variations in the cereals which nature presents to us are not only hereditary, but that they proceed upon a fixed principle, and from them I have deduced the following law of development of cereals:—1. Every fully developed plant whether of wheat, oats, or barley, presents an ear superior in productive power to any of the rest on that plant.

Thus by means of repeated selection alone, length of the ears has been doubled, their contents nearly trebled, and the "tillering" power of the seed increased five-fold.
