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The suspension of Mr. Tooth from his office, his subsequent imprisonment for disobedience to the judgment of Lord Penzance, and the forcible taking of the church of St. James's, Hatcham, from his charge and placing it under the charge of another clergyman, have apparently convinced the more active and militant of the party that the only alternative is submission to the State or emancipation from its control. And as the former is necessarily abhorrent Anglican Catholic, who shares with his Roman brother the passion for power and authority which finds its fullest development in the Pope. he elects to be disestablished. Two meetgs, it has been stated, have been held in London to promote the freedom of the Church of England in spiritual matters from State control, and those present sensibly resolved that the only way to accomplish their object is by the separation of the Church from the State A Disestablishment League has been formed; and, till the month of May, a provisional committee, consisting of fifteen priests, were to conduct the preliminary business of the new organization.


