
The French Prince Imperial is suffering from a sharp attack of fever.

South AMERICA .- The first naval encounter took place on the 16th off the river Loa between the Chilian corvete Magallanes and the Peruvian vessels Union and Pileomayo. Little damage occurred, the Chilian vessel withdrawing.
