

Mexico.—The Governor General has issued a decree sequestering the territory of cities which recently revolted, and imposing the extraordinary contribution of 255,000 francs upon them.

**SOUTH AFRICA.**—In the House of Commons on Wednesday afternoon, Sir Michael Hicks Beach, Colonial Secretary, announced the receipt of a telegram dated Cape Town, July 8th, confirming news of a decisive victory by Lord Chelmsford over the Zulus, virtually ending the war. Chelmsford remained in camp till the afternoon of July 3rd, awaiting the surrender of cannon and 1,000 rifles, captured by the Zulus at Isandula. These not arriving, he advanced and was attacked in the open country by 15,000 Zulus, who fled under a heavy fire by the British. Chelmsford then advanced and destroyed Ulundi. The Zulu loss was 800. The British lost 10 killed and 53 wounded.

Zulu prisoners state that twelve regiments, aggregating 20,000 men, participated in the attack. Lord Chelmsford estimates the Zulu loss at not less than 1,000.

The steadiness of the troops, who at one time during the engagement, were under a complete belt of fire was remarkable.

General Wolseley telegraphs from Durban, July 7, as follows: "I have halted all reinforcement here, as I believe the war over. Do not send any more men or supplies till you hear from me. I expect to meet a great Zulu chief about the 16th inst., and discuss terms of peace with him."

A Times correspondent says the question whether Cetewayo will surrender or not is of little importance, as in event of his proving stubborn the British can place his brother Oham, who surrendered some time ago, in possession of the lower and far more fertile part of Zululand, and by assuring Oham some little support at the commencement of his reign, can establish a complete bulwark between Cetewayo and the British colonies.
