

It is reported that Mr. Joseph S. Belcher has resigned his School Commissionership.

The Yarmouth shipping list, published in the Herald, shows that the total tonnage of the port is one hundred and fifty-three thousand tons, being an increase for the past year of eleven thousand tons.

At the meeting of the Chamber of Commerce on Friday, the following resolution was submitted by W. C. Silver, seconded by S. A. White and adopted:—

"Resolved, That this Chamber appeal to the Government to take such means as is necessary to carry into effect the long cherished hope of making Halifax the shipping Winter Port of the Dominion.

"And the delegates are also requested to bring the subject before the Dominion Board of Quebec, and use all their energies when the matter is discussed." On finding Mr. Pickford opposed to a protective tariff, discussion arose as to whether he should not resign his position as a delegate to the Dominion Board of Trade. The meeting was adjourned to Friday next to fully consider the matter.

The N. S. Journal of Agriculture has a list of the flowers in the bouquet presented to the Princess Louise at Truro. It was said to have been "the most exquisite bouquet ever seen in Nova Scotia, fit only for a Princess."

The same publication has the rules and prize list of the N. S. Poultry and Floricultural Exhibition to be held at the new Masonic Hall on Tuesday, Feb. 25th, and following days. It also states that "Mr. A. F. Stevens, of Natick, Mass., has been engaged to award the prizes at this exhibition. He is a gentleman of wide experience and reputation as a judge, having acted in that capacity at one hundred and twenty shows. Exhibitors may therefore rely on having their specimens judged on their merits."
