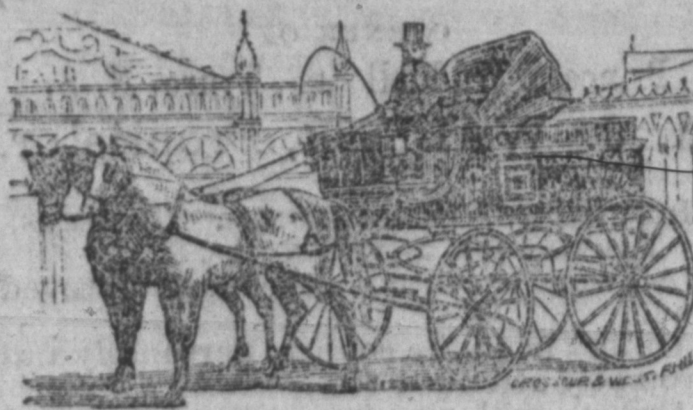
Mrs. L. (formerly Miss Vaux), was for several years a much respected and beloved member of Granville Street Church, Halifax.
