AGRICULTURE.

HIGH ART IN FARMING.—A friend writes us from Litchfield, Conn.: "We drove to the Starr (or 'Echo') farm, one and a half miles, about 90 of which are of Jersey breed, (pure)."

THE HOUSEHOLD. TO COOK BACON.—Cut the bacon into thin slices, put it in the oven on a plate, and just before it is to be sent to table frizzle the slices before the fire.

BROWNING FOR SOUP.—Take a pound of the coarsest brown sugar and a pint of cold water. Put the sugar in a saucepan and stir it well until it browns then add by degrees the cold water, and stir until it boils.

WHITEWASH.—For a good whitewash, slack say one peck of lime, and while hot and of the thickness of cream add a quart of linseed oil and a quarter-pound of glue.

In England a heavy fine is imposed on any persons who sell bread having alum in it. In a recent case there were found 36 grains to a 4 lb loaf and the baker was fined £5 and costs.

PREPARED VEAL.—Chop 3 pounds of veal steak with two slices of salt pork, a handful of sage, a little salt and pepper, chop fine, add three or four pulverized crackers, and two eggs, mix all well together, and form into a loaf.

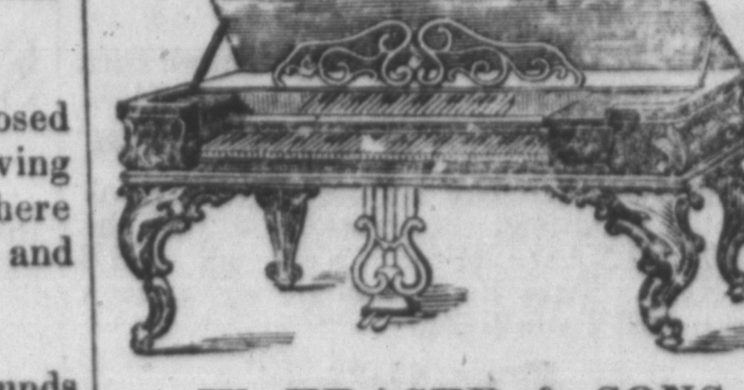
