UNITED STATES.—The President on Thursday last issued a proclamation warning all persons from trespassing upon land of Indian territory.

Early on Wednesday morning a fire originating from the furnace of the Trinity Episcopal Church, 4th Avenue and 125th Street, New York destroyed the edifice. Loss, \$125,000; insured for \$50,000.

At San Francisco, several hundred unemployed workmen on Wednesday last demanded that the Central Pacific Railway Company discharge all Chinamen and employ whites.

A fire at Albany, on Tuesday morning in the County Clerk's office, destroyed the City Hall building. The walls only are standing.

While a ball was in progress at the Opera House at Central City, on Thursday evening, a heavy wind carried the front of the building into the street.

Yesterday the last spike to complete the branch of the Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe Railway to Santa Fe was driven by Governor Wallace, on Wednesday amid much rejoicing.

ENGLAND.—It is reported that Baroness Burdett Coutts intends to expend half a million pounds to afford permanent relief for Ireland by investing it in the purchase of land in Connemara and Galway Counties, to be afterwards let to small tenants on long leases, at moderate rates.
