

Students may enter as (1) Undergraduates, with the intention of applying for a University Degree in Arts or Science at the end of their course, or (2) as General Students who do not look forward

In Greek.—Xenophon, Anabasis, Book I. Instead of the above, equivalents may be offered, if they be not parts of the Under-graduate course, on giving a week's notice to the Secretary of the Senate.

II. IN MATHEMATICS .- Arithmetic; Euclid's Elements of Geometry, Books I. and 11; Algebra, Simple Rules and Simple involving Surds.

England; Geography; Composition. The subjects for entrance into the first year of the Science course are:

I. IN MATHEMATICS .- Same as for the First Year in Arts. II. In English.—The same as for the first

year in Arts. III. IN LATIN OR GREEK OR FRENCH:-Latin.—The subjects of the Matriculation Examination for the First Year in Arts. German.—Grammar and Translation.

French.—Grammar and Translation. The following Bursaries and Scholarships are offered for competition at the Matriculation Examinations :-

1.—The Munro Bursaries.

GEORGE MUNRO, Esq., the founder of

graduate Course, taken consecutively; provided that the holder of Bursary gain a Certificate of Merit at the Sessional Examinations of the first year. After these two years, the Bursaries are again to be competed for, and will be held during the third and fourth years of the Course, on Terms similar to those of the preceding years.

The Bursaries will be awarded to those Students from the several districts mentioned, who make the highest total of marks at the Matriculation Examinations: but no Bursary will be awarded unless a Standard of Merit, determined by the Senate, shall be reached by the candidate.

The Examinations for the Munro Bursaries are the same as those for Professors'

Scholarships. application to the Principal.
