

Ragusa, from Scutari, where he deemed it dangerous to stay. Other consuls remain at their posts. Riza Pasha awaits instructions from Constantinople, and has not yet replied to Admiral Seymour's ultimatum.

It was expected that an advance on Dulcigno would be made on Saturday last. Turkish war ships are at Voldence and Modusa.

EGYPT.—The rise in the Nile is quite up to the average. The prospects of the crops are satisfactory.

INDIA.—The following persons were killed by the land-slide at Naina Tal, one of the hill stations of North-West India:—L. Taylor, Assistant Commissioner of Road Police; Rev. Mr. Robertson, Chaplain; Major Murphy, of the 40th Regt.; Mrs. Murphy; Mr. Morgan, Road Overseer; Mrs. Turnbull, Capt. Fredk. Goodridge, Surgeon Hannah, Capt. Haines, of the Royal Engineers; Capt. Balderson, Lieut. Sullivan, Dr. Hatchell and Lieut. Carmichael.

CHINA.—There are reports of serious disturbances in Canton. Europeans have been threatened and are in a state of alarm. The Catholic Commission has been attacked. The military have been called out. Several rioters have been killed and wounded.
