BRIDGEWATER.—A young man near Bridgewater, while engaged in sinking rocks, was caught between two stones, and crushed to death.

Mr. B. Rheinardt, Sub-Collector of Customs at LaHave, died suddenly on Monday night while presiding at the annual school meeting.

Upper Stewiacke is to-day celebrating its 100th Anniversary. The Committee of Arrangements consists of about sixty ladies and gentlemen, who intend to make it a success. His Honor, Governor Archibald, Hon. Samuel Creelman, Rev. Dr. Sedgwick and others will deliver addresses. It has been decided to have a free lunch for over 600 visitors. The Truro Band will discourse sweet music on the occasion. The Presbyterian congregation of South Branch will provide tea in aid of their church at a moderate rate.

The brig, Ellen C., of Digby, 295 tons, from Sydney for Annapolis, coal laden, ran on shore on Cape Negro Island on the night of the 28th Sept., and became a total wreck. The crew was saved. The Ellen C. was owned by A. W. Corbett & Son, of Annapolis.

Lunenburg had its regatta on Wednesday last. People came from all the surrounding country to witness the contests; here were eight or ten of different size boats.

REMARKABLE FRUITFULNESS.—The Bridgetown Monitor, says: We were shown yesterday, by the Collector of Customs for this port, a small twig about eight inches in length, bearing sixteen apples, some of them five or six inches in circumference.


