

SOUTH AFRICA — A telegram states that in the action reported with the Boers at Middleburg, 200 soldiers were killed and fifty taken prisoners.

The Governor of Natal telegraphs from Pietermaritzburg that the number of Boers in the field is estimated at 4,000, but it is thought that they cannot hold together. The Boers have issued a proclamation in the name of the Government and Valkstraad, and have written to Major Lanyou, expressing respect for the Queen and the British flag, and desire to avoid war, but express a determination to assert their independence, and requesting Major Lanyou to surrender to the Government without resistance. Major Lanyou has issued a proclamation offering pardon to all who withdraw from the malcontent camp.

The 97th Regiment, at Gibraltar, is now ordered to Natal instead of Ireland and will leave to-morrow. Though Governor Sir Geo. Colley did not ask for reinforcements, he intimated that he might want them, and it was thought better to dispatch the regiment to the Cape immediately, without running the risk of any greater emergency. A battalion of rifles from Aldershot has been ordered to Ireland instead.

The Times discredits the reported loss of 200 soldiers in an encounter with the Boers.

A Durban dispatch says riders from Standerton to Pretoria, were obliged to return, as the Boers are patrolling all the roads.

Standerton is being hastily fortified by the Loyalists. Every hour brings news of extension of the rising. The Boers threaten to attack Utrecht. Fifteen Loyalists at Walkerstrow and five at Utrecht have been threatened with death.
