THE TIDES.—The column of the Moon's Southing gives the time of high water at Parrsboro, Cornwallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, and Truro.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

SCIENCE.

A WATER REPELLANT.—New York manufacturers of and dealers in fabrics are exercised over an invention which is in many respects the most remarkable in that line of discovery.

At an exhibition last week, at which several distinguished ladies and gentlemen were present, some interesting experiments were made. Woollen cloths were taken, and a piece of white brocade was hung up. The lower part had not been dipped in the solution, and was quickly ruined, while the upper part threw off the water and seemed as dry and as bright as ever.

THE HOUSEHOLD.

POTATOES IN VARIOUS WAYS.—Cut cold potatoes in slices, sprinkle with salt, grid on a gridiron, and serve with butter. Cut pared raw potatoes into ribbons by paring round and round, drop into hot fat, and they brown instantly.

GOOD PLAIN GINGERBREAD.—Three quarters of a pound of flour; a quarter of a pound of butter; a quarter of a pound of sugar a quarter of a pound of molasses; a tablespoonful of cream, and ginger to the taste.

AGRICULTURE.

HEALTH OF HORSES.—The health and comfort of horses have of late years been greatly improved by the better construction of stables. They are made more roomy and lofty and provided with thorough ventilation.
