II. IN MATHEMATICS .- Arithmetic ; Euclid's Elements of Geometry, Books I. and 11; Algebra, Simple Rules and Simple Equations of one unknown quantity, not involving Surds.

111. IN ENGLISH.—Grammar ; History of England ; Geography ; Composition.




