Ship Borneo, of New York, Captain Shaw, oil laden, from New Orleans for Trieste, was dismasted on the 15th May. tried to make Halifax Harbor. During a dense fog on the 23rd inst. struck on Beaver Island ledge. The vessel is a total loss.


