TAT HEREAS circumstances have rendered it expedient to effect certain changes in the policy of the Government Lands, Public Notice is hereby given :-

1. The Regulations of the 14th October, 1879, were rescinded by order of His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the 20th day of May instant, and the following lands substituted therefor:


