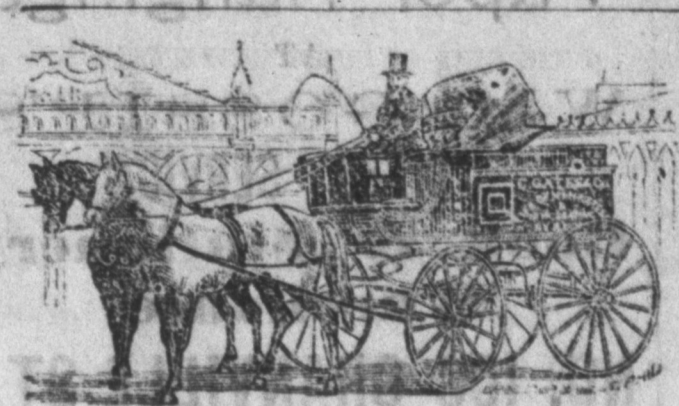

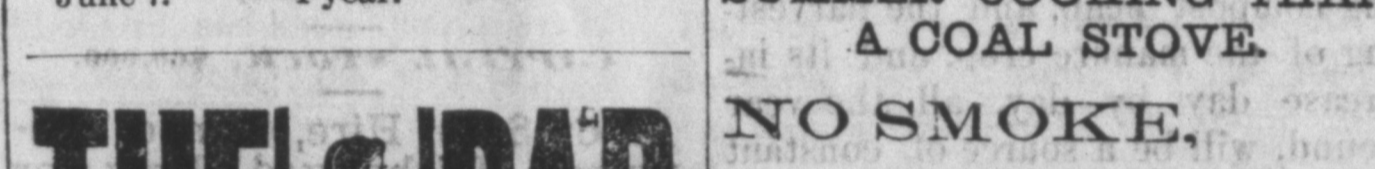

WILL ARRIVE: At 9.15 a. m.—Accommodation from Truro. At 10.15 a. m.—Express from Quebec and from St. John. At 2.10 p. m.—Accommodation from Picton. At 7.45 p. m.—Express from St. John. July 5, 1882.

Windsor and Annapolis Railway.

Summer Arrangement—Commencing Wednesday, June 7th, 1882.

The following is according to Railway Time. Halifax time is 15 minutes later.

GOING WEST. Halifax, Windsor, Annapolis, St. John, Truro.

GOING EAST. St. John, Truro, Annapolis, Windsor, Halifax.

THE SIDES.—The column of the water's surface gives the time of high water at Parrsboro, Cornwallis, Horton, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, and Truro.

High water at Picton and Cape Tormentine, 2 hours and 11 minutes LATER than at Halifax. At Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland, Maine, 2 hours and 25 minutes LATER, and at St. John's, Newfoundland, 20 minutes EARLIER, than at Halifax.

At Charlottetown, 2 hours 56 minutes LATER. A Westport, 2 hours 54 minutes LATER. A Yarmouth, 2 hours 30 minutes LATER.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE DAY.—Add 12 hours to the time of the sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of the sun's setting, from 12 hours and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.
