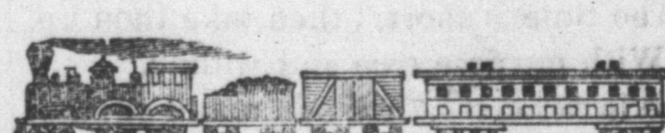

Winter Arrangement - Commencing Monday, Nov. 21st, 1881.

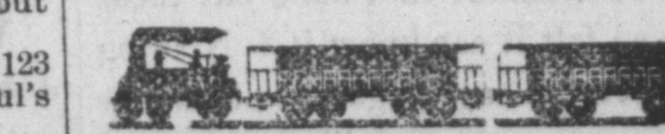
