A house owned by Mr. B. B. Daniels, Lawrencetown, Annapolis, and occupied by Mr. Whitfield McNary, was totally destroyed by fire on Wednesday last.

Mr. Geo. Lewis and others, of Bass River and Upper Economy, are preparing to build a large vessel to be launched in 1882. On their way home from the woods the other day, where they were prospecting for timber, they killed a large bear, weighing about 500 pounds.

The P. E. Island Parliament was dissolved on Saturday last. The elections will take place on the 8th of May. The opinion is expressed that the Government will be sustained by a large majority.

On Friday night the debate on the Supplies was continued through the night, until half past seven Saturday morning. Hon. Mr. Blake was speaking till half-past three and was followed by Sir John A. McDonald, who then spoke for an hour, after which the House divided on the motion by Mr. Caldwell of want of Confidence on account of disallowance of the Streams Bill passed in Ontario.

It is said to be impossible to bring Parliament to a close by the first of May. A fire occurred in the Customs Department at Ottawa on Tuesday last week. A lot of waste paper was discovered on fire by the policeman on duty and promptly extinguished.

A deputation from the Ottawa City Council waited upon Sir John Macdonald on Thursday to urge the city's claims for financial assistance from the Government, on account of heavy expenses incurred to make the city a capital worthy of the country.

If Ottawa cannot afford to be the capital perhaps some other city would not object. On Friday in the House of Commons, Dr. Borden called the attention of the Government to the fishery of the Gasperau River.

Mr. McLellan said this Government had a special examination made of a number of rivers in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, with the view of removing obstructions on these rivers for the very purpose of allowing the smaller fish to ascend them and increase the number of the larger fish to the coast.

In the afternoon, Sir S. L. Tilley moved that the House do resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the following resolutions: "That it is expedient that an annual grant of \$150,000 be made to aid in the development of the sea fisheries and the encouragement of the building and fitting out of improved fishing vessels, and the improvement of the condition of the fisherman."

In reply to Mr. Flynn, he said he would make a full statement as to the manner in which the money would be distributed on Tuesday.

One of the workmen who helped to remove them is descended from Krechting, and bears that name.

An English paper states that there is now living at Efailfach, in the county of Carmarthen, and old woman of the name Elizabeth Evans, who is 102 years of age. She is in perfect health, and often talks to Carmarthen, a distance of over two miles. She is familiarly known about her home as Bette Flynnonfelon, and every Sunday attends the Baptist Chapel at Rhydyrgeaun village.

A new method of collection has been adopted in a Presbyterian church in America. Small boxes with a slit in the top and glass in the sides are fastened to the backs of the pews.

A pastoral letter from the Archbishop of Quebec, denouncing "round" dances, was read on Sunday in the Roman Catholic churches of that diocese.
