THE TIDES.—The column of the Moon's Position gives the time of high water at Pictou, New Brunswick, and Truro.

High water at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 2 hours and 11 minutes later than at Halifax.

FOR THE LENGTH OF THE NIGHT.—Subtract the time of the sun's setting, from 12 hours and to the remainder add the time of rising next morning.
