For the Christian Messenger. Councils and the Independence of Churches.

A criticism of a recent article of mine under the above caption appears in your last issue. It seems to be based upon a misconception, or at least, might lead to misunderstanding and so demands a few words in reply.

My position was this. When there is a dissension in a church, dividing it into two opposing parties, there is ever liable to be enough excitement and prejudice to prevent agreement on what is best and most righteous. Under such circumstances a Council of dispassionate and judicious brethren are in a better position to reach a just decision than the interested parties. Surely, then it can be no violation of Baptist independ. ence for both the opposing parties to agree to submit their difficulty to the arbitration of such a body. To say that it is such, is to declare that Baptist independence forbids a church to seek such guidance as will most probably lead to the most righteous action, and shuts her in to her own conflicting bias. This would be independence with a vengeance. Let us be careful lest we harbor tyranny under this sacred name. For a church, under these circumstances voluntarily to accept the decision of a Council is not to be blindfold as,' but intelligently to defer to a judgment more trustworthy than her own, which is very commendable. I presume also that Councils hold as great " powers of exorciam and infallibility" as the excited parties in a church dispute, and for both parties to yield a little, under the advice of God fearing brethren, would not endanger any principle much more than




