CANADIAN ELECTRICS.—The Dominion Statistician has compiled some interesting figures about the electric railways of Canada. During the year ended December 31, 1899, the 612 miles of track were so used that the total number of miles run by cars was 20,646,847.

The number of passengers carried was over 104,000,000 namely, 104,-033,659. This is equal to carrying every man, woman and child in the Dominion 20 times. The mileage run and the passengers carried show that for each mile run the electrics carried 3½ passengers.

Compared with the previous year the number of passengers carried increased nearly 9,500,000 and the number of miles run by over 1,000,000 the passengers carried per mile run increased from 3,500,000 to 4,500,000.


